On two bright, sunny Saturday mornings this past December, the doors opened to 1500 under-resourced families at five Community Christmas Shoppes across Ventura County. While one parent "shopped" for free toys and gifts in a boutique setting, the other family members enjoyed the hospitality and activities that each Shoppe provided.

Most importantly, the 3500 Christmas Shoppe guests encountered Jesus: 400 of the parents asked to be contacted by one of the participating churches, and almost 1,000 people received prayer.

It is amazing that together as a community we can provide happiness to so many needy families."

Carolyn Dosick, the Chairperson of the Port Hueneme Shoppe, got a call from an Oxnard business that wanted to donate 100 backpacks. When the driver arrived to unload the backpacks, she showed him around the Shoppe and explained what we do and why we do it. Carolyn says, "The next day, the driver showed up with \$200 worth of toys. He explained that his family was very poor and they were the recipients of a charity bringing toys to their door. He appreciated the way we distributed the toys, as it gave the families dignity and we did it in the name of Christ. He even showed up the next day to volunteer at the Shoppe!"
